READ THIS BEFORE YOU FILE FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE ABATEMENT

PLEASE PAY YOUR ENTIRE BILL TO AVOID INTEREST AND LATE FEES

Refunds take 4-6 weeks to process

Per MA State law, you are **not** entitled to an abatement if you:

- 1. retain ownership of the vehicle
- 2. move to another Massachusetts city or town, during the same calendar year

MA STATE LAW requires you must provide the following documents with your application:

SOLD: Bill of Sale AND Registration Cancellation Receipt from RMV

TRADED: Trade in receipt AND Copy of New Registration from RMV

<u>TOTAL LOSS</u>: Insurance Letter (must include year, make & model of vehicle) <u>AND</u> Registration Cancellation Receipt from RMV

<u>JUNKED OR DONATED</u>: Receipt from Junk Yard or Charity (must include year, make & model of vehicle) <u>AND</u> Registration Cancellation Receipt

<u>MOVED OUT OF STATE</u>: Copy of Registration from New State <u>AND</u> Registration Cancellation Receipt from RMV

<u>OVERVALUED</u>: Must show proof of overvaluation (MSRP from dealership <u>AND</u> Bill of Sale)

EXEMPTION: Documentation establishing qualifications

LEASED VEHICLES: If your vehicle is leased, the leasing company (as owner) is responsible for applying for the abatement. Please contact your leasing company regarding any refund which may be due to you.
